Let's dare to give back at the heart of development through

We must put people back at the heart of economic development to find the paths to sustainable growth. However, the increasing robotization of the economy has generated a spectacular increase in profits by relegating human beings to the sidelines of economic development plans. This situation is accentuated in France by the inequalities observed in access to education and training. A reality sanctioned by the latest PISA surveys (Programme for International Student Assessment) where France is losing places. These surveys point out the inequalities affecting children in France in access to education. A country that trains or educates its youth poorly is threatened with economic decline.

During the episode of confinement, we were able to observe that despite all the efforts of the teachers, nearly 10% of the children deprived of school had lost their footing and had not given any news for several weeks now.

There is a need for a response that is not global but adapted to make the excellence of education and training accessible to a greater number of children.

Equality through education

We find that social reproduction is working at full capacity while the social elevator is at a standstill.

Various international surveys show that French schools are champions of the inequalities that persist until entry into the world of work.

The access to the real égalité for students and citizens cannot be done without the implementation of a real équité of the means to obtain it. Indeed, each citizen is in a unique situation and according to each situation the needs are different in means and cost.

We strongly advocate for equal access to educational success for all children in the nation, including the inclusion of children with disabilities in regular schools.

We propose to increase the number of adults in schools.

We also want culture to penetrate so-called difficult neighborhoods and rural areas. It will be necessary to acquire higher education and to continue learning throughout one's life. The PISA tests showed that the level of French schoolchildren was below the

average of that of the OECD countries. The education system is not working well: 150,000 students a year leave the school system without a diploma.

During the period of confinement that we experienced, we found that more than 10% of the children had been "lost" by the National Education because they did not have the necessary tools to be able to follow the courses given by the teachers due to lack of material. This is why it will be necessary to multiply 2nd chance schools that contribute to offer a healthy academic catch-up.

Fight against poverty

In 2018, precariousness is becoming more widespread, and fear of the future for oneself or one's children is affecting increasingly large segments of the population. We must not accept these situations, we must not consider that they are hopeless. We must encourage all initiatives that allow us to stop thinking of poverty as inevitable.

More than 9.3 million French people are poor, more than 14% of the French population lives below the poverty line.

The period of confinement that we are experiencing has increased these inequalities. We have seen this particularly in the case of housing.

This is why it is necessary to launch the construction of a minimum of 150,000 social housing units per year, 50% of which are very social and financed by the use of assisted rental integration loans, PLAI. At a minimum, 75,000 housing units would be at very low rents. A roof for all is an obligation.

It is urgent to ensure a minimum old age and retirement pensions at least equivalent to the minimum wage for all.

A determined fight must be waged with the social partners to obtain an increase in women's wages in all professional branches. We have seen that in many sectors they have been in the front line.

A reform of the policy towards dependent persons

There is an urgent need to reform our dependency care system. Family structures have changed and the elderly are no longer welcomed in families at the end of their lives. Older people are therefore "placed" in retirement homes that take them in.

However, the crisis, the chopped careers lead to a sharp decrease in the incomes of retirees and unfortunately the remaining dependents for families is growing.

This situation tends to create even more financial difficulties by shifting the burden to the offspring who are themselves in difficulty.

Dependency is a risk and therefore should be covered.

It is necessary to create a 5th branch of the social security system dedicated to the problem of dependency.

Our proposal is collective and mutualist.

This new branch will be responsible for expenses related to the loss of dependency, such as home help or nursing home accommodation.

It will also allow the development of employment in the personal assistance sector and will allow the development of a real professional network ensuring quality care for the elderly.

The creation of a contribution paid by all within the framework of solidarity will make it possible to finance part of the expenses.

Serious thought must be given to the construction of accommodation facilities that are halfway between the geriatric hospital center and the EHPAD.

Women's rights

Inequalities persist in many areas: violence, wage and professional inequalities, sexism... In the face of repeated offensives by conservatives, we must move up a gear in terms of gender equality. We propose to build together a desirable future, a society that reduces violence against women, that improves their living and working conditions, and that makes equality a goal shared by all.

Doubling the budget of the Ministry of Women's Rights to carry out wide-ranging policies against inequalities.

Extension of paternity leave to 6 weeks, including 11 mandatory days, to meet the expectations of young parents and encourage the sharing of parental tasks.

Better protection for women victims of violence. I will create 4500 places of specialized accommodation. Complaints will be better handled, prosecutions will be systematic and judgments will be more rapid.

10% increase in the minimum old-age pension, of which more than half of the beneficiaries are single women.

Systematic monitoring and sanctions against companies that do not comply with their obligations in terms of professional equality and the revaluation of professions predominantly occupied by women.

A public early childhood service, with 250,000 new childcare places and adapted schedules. Schooling from the age of 2 will be developed.

Extension of paternity leave to 6 weeks, including 11 mandatory days, to meet the expectations of young parents and encourage the sharing of parental tasks.

Increase in the number of family planning centers and abortion facilities.

Real opening of medically assisted procreation to couples and single women.

Act 3 of the parity by increasing the fines to the parties, the non-cumulation in time and the introduction of a dose of proportionality in the National Assembly.

Child protection

Education begins, not at the age of two when children enter kindergarten, but much earlier, at birth.

Remember that two children a day die under the blows of their parents in France! The infant must be protégé by his parents. But the hardest of jobs, that of parents, does not benefit from any training. Also, when parents have suffered abuse in their childhood, they risk reproducing on their children what they themselves have suffered!

We offer educational assistance and training in positive, non-violent parenting. This will allow children to be truly protected in families, institutions and associations. End psychiatrists' control over the education of mentally disabled and autistic children.

Request the application of the Law of July 10, 2020, a law that organizes the progressive exit from a regime of exception.

Seek training for young parents, as well as for staff working with children.

If humanity wants to remain consistent between its will to change and its actions, protection of women and children, freedom to raise or work, man or woman, allowance until the start of the school year and then possible return to work. Refusal of a non protection of the family. Obligation for companies with at least 50 employees to reserve a place for childcare, CICE or dividends paid for this purpose only. The employee will participate on his salary to the operation of the childcare up to 100€/small salary up to 1700€, 250€ up to 2700€ and 450€€ beyond.

The child is the future of the company, the company must protect the employee's family.

Justice

Our freedoms must be defended more strongly by a more effective justice system. It must be endowed with means that allow it to be faster without being expeditious. The penitentiary administration must have the means to work on reintegration and prevention of recidivism, relying on the action of reintegration associations.

Freedoms must be defended against the resurgence of nauseating attitudes that have reappeared during the health crisis that has hit us.

Given that the magistrates render justice in the name of the people, it seems necessary that the organ of control and sanction of the magistrates, in this case the Superior Council of the Magistracy, be controlled by the people and not by the magistrates, because this creates a state within the state out of citizen control.

We propose that this disciplinary body should operate on the same basis as a court of assizes, and thus the latter can no longer be questioned, nor considered as a partial and parity body.

It is imperative that whistleblowers can be much better protected with a status all their own and that there is a real judicial follow-up of the crimes and misdemeanors revealed.

Culture and Media

We are seeing that the media are focusing on the sensational that attracts the reader or viewer at the expense of in-depth articles, reports, investigations and debates. Newspapers mostly write what their loyal readers want to read, not what their conscience as free columnists would like to put on paper.

The flow of information available to citizens has become considerable. One piece of information quickly chases away the other. Citizens are no longer able to distinguish its veracity.

We propose that citizens of all ages be trained to exercise their critical spirit in the framework of national education, popular education and associations.
